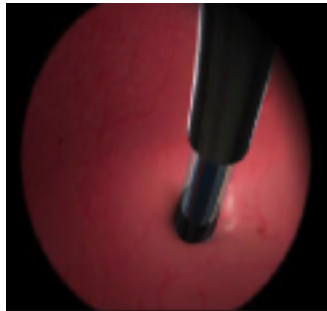


New Day Surgery

The Adiana permanent female contraceptive system is performed through the cervix with no skin incisions. It uses a controlled thermal lesion within the intramural portion of fallopian tube, with the placement of porous stable implant that result in tissue in growth and tubal occlusion.

A study of 645 procedures in 2008 (Vancaille) reported 99% were very satisfied with the procedure & 98% returned to normal activities within 1-2 days. There were no uterine or tubal perforations.



A novasure endometrial ablation can also be performed in conjunction with Adiana to treat menorrhagia. A study of 107 patients at 5 years found a 97% success rate (Gallinat 2007).

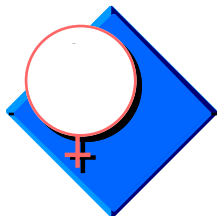

5 Year Sling Review

At the International Continence Society annual scientific meeting in Edinburgh this September, a 5 year review of two forms of prolene suburethral sling was presented (retropubic versus transobturator) (Laurikainen). The procedures had a high success rate (88% vs 93%), with a low incidence of complications, including urgency (3.6% vs 4.6%) and pelvic pain (2.3% vs 4.8%)
